

# Welcome to First Congregational Church of Fremont's historical service. This year, we are celebrating 150 years of loving our community. Since our founding in 1875, we have dedicated ourselves to God's glory and humankind's good by preaching the word, serving the sacraments, and caring for the needy. We joyfully tell others about the Kingdom of Heaven and Jesus Christ. Today, we celebrate this history by worshiping the way our ancestors might have when the church began. If you have worshiped with us before, you will notice several changes. First, there is no overhead projector. We are singing out of the Hymnal and reading from the Bible provided in the pew.

The pastor is wearing a preaching robe similar to what the early ministers would have worn. The service has a much simpler structure. It is made up of prayer, song, scripture, and sermon. You will notice a lack of prewritten prayers or pieces rooted in the deep history of the church. The service is rooted in the simplicity of early Congregationalism and Revivalism. You may recognize the songs, but each one could and very likely was sung in 1875. This service is to remind us of that long history.
